Film Screening at Sault College

(Sault Ste. Marie, ON February 24, 2011) Sault College alumnus and winner of the 2011 Governor Generals Award, Shelly Nelson Bond, is organizing a fundraiser in partnership with the Child and Youth Worker program and the Shadows of the Mind film festival. On Tuesday March 1, a pre-shadows movie screening of “El baño del Papa” (The Pope’s Toilet) will be screened in the Multi Media Centre at Sault College.

“El baño del Papa” (The Pope’s Toilet) is an alternately touching, humorous movie with plenty of poignant social messages. The film is set in 1988 in a Uruguayan town on the Brazilian border that awaits the visit of Pope John Paul II. 50,000 people are expected to attend, and the most humble locals believe that selling food and drink to the multitude will just about make them rich. Petty smuggler Beto thinks he has the best idea of all – he decides he will build a Water Closet in front of his house and charge for its use. His efforts bring about unexpected consequences, and the final results will surprise everyone. This movie is in Spanish with English subtitles.

“Everyone is very excited,” states Shelly Nelson Bond, Sault College Child and Youth Worker Alumnus. “We are grateful to the Shadows organization for letting us use their event to raise our profile as we develop our Child and Youth Worker Alumni group. Supporting the third year students in their annual WALK and this year’s recipient, Christy’s Light Foundation is very important to us,” states Nelson Bond.

The screening is open to the public and free parking is available in the A-Lot parking lot located across the street from the College. Admission to this event is by donation to the third year Child and Youth Worker community development class's annual We All Love Kids (WALK) with proceeds going to Christy's Light Foundation. Doors open at 6:00pm and the movie will begin at 7:00pm.
