Sault College - Compulsory Ancillary Fees:	2023 - 2024 Ancillary Fees
<b>Academic Support - Academic Transition Fee</b> This fee is collected to provide students with access to the Transition to College program prior to beginning classes.	\$5.00 annually \$2.50 per term
<b>Academic Support - Peer Tutoring Fee</b> This fee is collected to provide Peer Tutoring services to students across a wide variety of subjects and program areas.	\$40.00 annually \$20.00 per term
<b>Academic Support - Testing Services Fee</b> This fee is collected to provide students with out of class testing services within the Testing Centre.	\$10.00 annually \$5.00 per term
<b>Academic Technology Support Fee</b> This fee is collected to allocate resources to acquire equipment and services designed to improve student success by technology.	\$120.00 annually \$60.00 per term
<b>Athletics &amp; Recreation Fee</b> This fee is collected to provide students with access to athletic and recreation programming and facilities to support healthy student lifestyles.	\$170.00 annually \$85.00 per term
<b>Employment &amp; Career Services Fee</b> This fee is collected to provide students with access to supports and resources to improve student career and employment opportunities while attending college and upon graduation.	\$55.00 annually \$27.50 per term
<b>Health &amp; Counselling - Health Support Fee</b> This fee is collected to deliver health services provided to all students through the Health Centre such as on-site immunization clinics, physician appointments, emergency transportation to health care, first aid treatment.	\$35.00 annually \$17.50 per term
<b>Health &amp; Counselling - Mental Health Support Fee</b> This fee is collected to deliver mental health supports such as counselling, indigenous cultural supports, other mental health practitioners and mental health education initiatives for students.	\$35.00 annually \$17.50 per term
<b>Student Achievement &amp; Records Fee</b> This fee is assessed to students in their first semester of a program. All program transfers will include an additional Student Achievement & Records Fee, assessed in their first semester of study in a new program. This fee represents a minimal contribution to the annual Convocation ceremonies and record activities.	\$50.00 1 <sup>st</sup> semester plus program transfers
<b>Student Financial Assistance Fee</b> This fee is collected to provide students with financial preparation supports while attending College.	\$15.00 annually \$7.50 per term
<b>Student ID Cards - Campus One Card Fee</b> This fee is collected to provide students with a student ID card as required. The card provides students with an ID card that allows access to student spaces and services on campus.	\$15.00 annually \$7.50 per term
<b>Alumni Fee</b> This fee is assessed to students in their first semester of a program and funds are used to provide Alumni services and membership. It secures Sault College Alumni Membership following graduation and provides access to exclusive programming and events such as reunions, affinity discounts and access to Alumni Support and Referral Services beyond graduation.	\$15.00 1 <sup>st</sup> semester one-time fee
<b>Locker Fee</b> This fee is collected to provide students with access to a locker for use during the semester. Students are able to register for use of a locker to store their personal belongings while on campus. The registration is managed by the Physical Resources Office in B1140.	\$15.00 annually \$7.50 per term
<b>WUSC Fee / Student Refugee Sponsorship Program</b> WUSC is the acronym for the World University Service of Canada. This fee enables a long-term commitment to support a WUSC Student Refugee with their education and living costs for their first full year of living and studying at Sault College.	\$5.00 annually \$2.50 per term

<p><b>Academic Support - Student Support Fee</b> This fee is collected to support services delivered by the Sault College Students' Union (SCSU) that enhance academic studies and student success such as, but not limited to, program required equipment loan out, Sault College academic appeal process guidance and academic learning opportunities through work placements with SCSU.</p>	\$50.00 annually \$25.00 per term
<p><b>Health &amp; Counselling Wellness Programming Fee</b> This fee is collected by the Sault College Students' Union to assist the delivery of programs that support student health and wellness through provisions such as, but not limited to, safe space student workstations, Nutrition Programs, awareness weeks and health resource materials and partnerships.</p>	\$35.00 annually \$17.50 per term
<p><b>Student Buildings – Health &amp; Wellness Building Trust Fee</b> This fee is collected by the Sault College Students' Union as a contribution to the Health &amp; Wellness Centre building.</p>	\$100.00 annually \$50.00 per term
<p><b>Student Buildings - Athletics Equipment Investment Fund Fee</b> This fee is collected by the Sault College Students' Union as a student contribution to the fitness equipment for the Health &amp; Wellness Centre.</p>	\$16.00 annually \$8.00 per term
<p><b>Student Buildings - Capital Improvement Fee</b> This fee is collected by the Sault College Students' Union to help offset any construction costs and equipment purchases for the Student Life Centre (Odeno and SCSU).</p>	\$20.00 annually \$10.00 per term
<p><b>Student Buildings - Student Life Centre Operations Fee</b> This fee is collected by the Sault College Students' Union to support the overall operations of the Student Life Centre (Odeno and SCSU). It helps offset the cost associated with utilities and overhead of the Student Life Centre.</p>	\$48.00 annually \$24.00 per term
<p><b>Chapters &amp; Clubs Membership Fee</b> Sault College Students' Union (SCSU) makes getting involved easy. <p><b>NEW Student Legal Services Plan Fee</b> The SCSU Legal Protection Program is a new program that ensures that SCSU members (full-time Sault College students) have the tools and financial means to defend their legal rights, and have unlimited access to legal consultation for any area of law and notary/commissioning services. Additionally, students would have access to legal representation for matters pertaining to housing rights or tenant disputes, employment rights, and academic rights. Students are assessed this fee in the term for which it applies. The Field Camp Fee covers the costs of food, travel and accommodations during the entirety of the camp.
