The Project Manager is responsible to assist the communities to administer and provide contribution funding for the ongoing provision of culturally appropriate prevention, including early interventions, least intrusive measures, legislated protection services to respond to children at risk of harm or maltreatment, support family preservation and well-being, including cultural and linguistic connections for First Nations children, youth and families ordinarily resident on reserve through devolution of services from Nogdawindamin to the individual communities. The Project Manager will consult with the North Shore Tribal Council First Nation communities and work with members of the Agency Senior Management Team, Ministries and Department of Indigenous Services Canada.

Required Skills

- Required undergraduate degree in Human Services, graduate degree an asset;
- Required five (5) years' experience at a senior level position within the Child Welfare System, working knowledge of the CYFSA, Child Welfare Data Elements, funding framework and organizational service systems;
- Required five (5) years' experience working directly with First Nation's communities in a research and/or consultation capacity
- Equivalent combination of education and experience may be considered

Other Requirements

- Respect for, sensitivity towards as well as knowledge and understanding of Anishnawbek culture, traditions and the Seven Grandfather Teachings
- Ability to understand and speak Anishnaabemowin is a definite asset
- Must provide a Criminal Records Check deemed satisfactory by the employer
- Must have a Class 'G' Ontario Driver's Licence, access to a vehicle and the ability to travel
- Must have \$1M automobile insurance coverage
